How can I find out more about a soldier's military career?

Surviving Records relating to soldiers whose service ended in or before 1920, (form Other Ranks) and 1922 (for Commissioned Officers) are held by the National Archives (formerly known as the Public Record Office), Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey. TW9 4DU.

Service Records relating to soldiers who served after 1920 (for Other Ranks) and 1922 (for Commissioned Officers) are still held by the Ministry of Defence (MoD).

A 'Record of Service' is a document including the serviceman or woman's Service Number; Date of Entering Service; Promotions; Postings and Units; Honours and Awards; Civilian Qualifications; and the Date of Leaving the Service. This may be used as a basis for further research.

Personal records are confidential. Only an ex-Serviceman or, in the case of the deceased, the Official Next-of-Kin or the person nominated by the Next-of-Kin, will be allowed access to the information.
